

Waldorf Early Childhood Workshop: What? Why? How? - Practical Aspects and Theory June 21-25, 2010

BASED ON THE RESPONSES LIKE THE ONE ABOVE, we have decided to offer a half-day session for moms, dads, babysitters, caregivers, grandparents.... anyone who has the best interests of children at heart.

The faculty consists of 5 very experienced teachers. Dorit Winter will guide conversation based on short excerpts of text by Rudolf Steiner. Glenda Monasch will offer movement to enliven the imagination: stories, verses, songs and poems to bring the world alive imaginatively for the young child through simple eurythmy elements. Marianne Alsop and Kate Hammond will work with the group on activities and story telling for children, focusing on rhythm, repetition and respect as the basis for protecting the life forces of the young child. And for those who can stay after lunch, Chris Guilfoil will offer painting as soul nourishment for caregivers and will include practical advice on painting with children, and consideration of how children's paintings metamorphose as childhood progresses.

TO ACCOMMODATE REQUESTS FOR FOCUS AND CONCENTRATION on one art form, we provide a week in which you may choose either singing, or painting or sculpture. Participants will have 4 hours a day for singing, or 3¾ hours a day for painting or sculpture. A second week of sculpture with an additional choice of eurythmy and/or study of Rudolf Steiner's planetary seals is also possible. These courses will accommodate all levels of experience from Beginner to advanced.

Daily Schedule: Singing with Christiaan Boele

This course is for all who want to deepen their understanding of singing: how we build our instrument, how we care for the precious gift of our voice, and how we find joy in singing. We will discover how the voice connects with all aspects of life. Open to anyone wanting to invite new impulses into life, wanting to have new experiences!

Daily Schedule: Sculpture with Ken Smith

This course provides the opportunity for participants to experience the essential character of sculpture in which we use our own living, form-giving ability to shape physical substance; to create out of lifeless clay and stone images of beauty and harmony, drama and intensity; and to search with our intelligent hands for outer forms that give expression to our inner questions.

We will study Rudolf Steiner's sculptural works as a basis for our own artistic explorations in polarity and metamorphosis. Participants will work with clay, plaster and stone. There will be a balance of taught sessions and open studio time for participants to continue their artwork.

A SECOND WEEK OF SCULPTURE WILL BE OFFERED to enable the metamorphosis which more resistant media require. Two additional morning courses are possible:

Planetary Movements in Eurythmy, with Glenda Monasch: Eurythmy is sculpture in movement; sculpture is movement brought to rest. Eurythmy

provides a unique insight into the qualities and dynamics of the planets, those creative processes behind the organic forms in us. Each has its own movement, rhythm, and expression, and, through signature choreographic forms, we will come closer to experiencing their life-giving and renewing forces.

Rudolf Steiner's Planetary Seals, with Patrick Marooney: Rudolf

Steiner's Planetary Seals provide ample material for the study and experience of metamorphosis. With pencil and paper, we will work intensively with basic, archetypal principles governing growth, evolution and change. These same principles apply equally to all of outer nature as well as to our inner life of soul.

WE ARE FORTUNATE THAT ONCE AGAIN CHRISTOF WIECHERT, leader of the Pedagogical Section of the worldwide Waldorf movement, will join us to continue sharing his inestimable insights into the heart and soul of Waldorf education.

Christof writes: "One requirement of a new educational paradigm is as rich as possible an understanding of the human being. The *Study of Man*, 14 lectures held by Rudolf Steiner for the extraordinary group of pioneering teachers at the first Waldorf School in Stuttgart, is the fundamental, highly complex and extremely dense text which constitutes the alpha and omega of such an understanding of the human being as a developing being. Working on this text generates new impulses, refreshment and renewal; these are the air a Waldorf teacher needs to breathe.

Until now the traditional way to 'study' *Study of Man* in conferences, was to hear lectures about the content. During the next two summers (2010 and 2011) we want to try a different approach. We want to get to the essence of the content through mutual conversation and mutual study. Therefore we are pleased that Waldorf schools will present their own findings to fellow teachers. Conversation groups will contemplate the presentations in order to arrive at new insights through mutual work. The form itself promises revitalization and strengthening not only for individual teachers but also for the community of schools."

Faculty

Dave Alsop is Assistant Director of the Bay Area Center for Waldorf Teacher Training. From 1974 until 2008 he held numerous positions of leadership in the Waldorf movement. In the Bay Area Center for Waldorf Teacher Training he teaches the Threefold Nature of Social Life, Philosophy of Freedom, and Reincarnation and Karma.

Marianne Alsop has been involved with Waldorf parent education for over 20 years. She teaches in the San Francisco Waldorf School Parenting Program and is a Board member of LifeWays North America and Co-Director of the California Coast LifeWays Training in Marin County and Big Sur.

Christiaan Boele is a professional musician who practices and teaches the singing technique known as Uncovering the Voice. A Waldorf graduate, he conducts master classes and courses in Europe and North America for singers and the general public. Christiaan teaches singing in the Bay Area Center for Waldorf Teacher Training summer session.

Sibylle Eichstaedt has been working as a free-lance speech artist and teacher since 1989. Based in the Cotswolds in England, she is currently doing further studies in anthroposophic therapeutic speech. She teaches in the Bay Area Center for Waldorf Teacher Training and has been a Summer Arts Festival teacher since 1996.

Christopher Guilfoil is on the faculty of Waldorf Teacher Education Eugene. He currently directs the Arts Enrichment Project, a community center for the arts and anthroposophy located on the campus of the Eugene Waldorf School. He teaches painting in the summer session of the Bay Area Center for Waldorf Teacher Training.

Kate Hammond worked for a number of years in kindergarten in New Zealand and taught in the kindergarten training course at Emerson College. She currently runs workshops for kindergarten teachers on principles of Waldorf pedagogy, and for parents on themes such as "routine, rhythm and ritual," festivals in the home, and storytelling. She is also a puppeteer.

Patrick Marooney teaches upper elementary science, form drawing and woodworking at Waldorf Teacher Education Eugene. A former class teacher, he has two decades of Waldorf experience. He teaches upper grades geometry and science in the summer sessions of the Bay Area Center for Waldorf Teacher Training.

Glenda Monasch teaches eurythmy in Boulder, CO. She has extensive performing experience and is Co-director of Sound Circle Eurythmy. Glenda teaches at Shining Mountain Waldorf School and at TARA Performing Arts High School. She is also a therapeutic eurythmist. She is the summer session eurythmy teacher for the Bay Area Center for Waldorf Teacher Training.

Lisa Sargent teaches music and choir at the San Francisco Waldorf School and at the Bay Area Center for Waldorf Teacher Training. She studied voice and music education at the University of Denver. Lisa graduated from the Bay Area Center for Waldorf Teacher Training in July of 2006.

Ken Smith trained in gardening and landscape design in New Zealand. He completed the sculpture training at Emerson College, England, and was the art teacher at the Hereford Waldorf School. He was course leader of Visual Arts and Sculpture at Emerson College. Currently he is a freelance artist and art teacher in the Bay of Plenty, New Zealand. Ken is the sculpture teacher for the Bay Area Center for Waldorf Teacher training.

Dorit Winter is Director of the Bay Area Center for Waldorf Teacher Training and of the Summer Arts Festival. She is a Waldorf graduate. She has been in Waldorf Education since 1973 and continues to be active as a Waldorf teacher, adult educator, author, mentor and lecturer. She teaches a variety of subjects in both the weekend and summer courses.

Special Guest Lecturer

Christof Wiechert, a Waldorf graduate, has been the leader of the Pedagogical Section at the Goetheanum in Dornach, Switzerland, since 2001. In that capacity he has traveled the world, working with and inspiring Waldorf teachers, and helping to promote research within the context of the Pedagogical Section of the School for Spiritual Science. He taught at the Waldorf School in Den Haag, Holland, for over 40 years, and was a co-founder of the teacher training seminar in the Netherlands. For many years he was a member in the Executive Council of the Anthroposophical Society in the Netherlands.


