Recording your coursework:

• Camera or smartphone to take pictures of completed work and a computer to save images and to upload to Padlet.

Sculpting:

- 1 square sculpture board about 11 inches x 11 inches. (5/8-inch-thick plywood is good).
- 1 spray bottle.

1 25-pound bag of clay.

Clay for pottery is smoother and more 'slippery' and not so easy to sculpt with. If you need help finding a good clay let me know.

- Large plastic bags to cover your work to keep the clay moist.
- 24 inch x 24 inch Sand tray.

• Drawing paper for around 9 x 12 inches

Watercolor brushes – 1" flat (part synthetic, part natural hair) – 2 of these; #10 or 12 round; any small mixing brush – could be bristle

• An equilateral glass or acrylic prism for prism experiments. For example:

Soft charcoal, natural willow or vine if possible, not compressed charcoal that is square
and has oil it. Thicker pieces (7-12+ mm diameter) are easier to work with.

- Soft (chalk not oil) pastels in a basic range of colors. Colored pencils can also be used for many of the exercises and are good to have for notes and sketches.

- Blending materials: soft rags, cotton balls or pads, Q-tips, paper towels. Pieces of wool roving or chamois cloth are optional. Some people also like sponge applicators.

Soft eraser, e.g., white plastic eraser, art gum eraser, Vanish 4 in 1 eraser, etc. that
doesn't leave marks. Some people like a gummie (kneadable) eraser (ok when new but
can leave a track if too used.)

• Paper that has a bit of tooth or texture for working with charcoal and pastel. For some exercises, ~11x14" would be good; for larger drawings ~21x16". Strathmore 500 Series Charcoal Paper (100% cotton) is very nice, but you can test various drawing or sketching papers you may have to see if dry media can be blended on them. Since this is an international program, it isn't assumed that specific brands are available everywhere, so you will need to test what is available to you.

- Watercolor paper Arches 140lb (300gms) Cold Press is ideal, but any 100% cotton 140lb Cold Press paper would probably be fine for our work. A full sheet is ~22"x30". We will work with half sheets ~15"x20" or quarter sheets ~11"x15" or smaller. Single sheets should be available at art stores (for a higher price). Online orders generally require ordering multiple sheets. Some people like working on watercolor "blocks."

- A smooth board to tape your paper on to. It should be larger than ~16" x 21", the size of the paper for various charcoal exercises. This could be white acrylic or plastic, melamine, white panel board, white dry erase board, even clear plastic. Smooth Masonite is also a possibility for this usage. If it is flexible plastic, you will need to put a stronger board underneath it to support it if you prop up the top to work at a better angle.
